Agenda Item: Community Clean-Up Event at Sierraville

Background:

Supervisor Roen and staff attended a community meeting called by a number of local residents of Sierraville to discuss various options to provide improvements to the community such as clean up events, volunteer work parties, enforcement, grants, and other programs. The concept of a community clean up event seemed to be the most popular event that would allow improving community appearance to be embraced by the entire community. Those attending were informed of how the County participated and coordinated clean up events in Loyalton, Sierra Brooks, and a couple of more specialized events that centered around car bodies and tires. The group was very energized and many offered to assist in passing out information, assisting in collection, and other coordination activities.

The County needs to take responsibility to coordinate the event, line up the current disposal transportation contractor (Intermountain), coordinate days and hours, determine extent of county forces needed to load materials and so forth.. The issues of disposing of tires and car bodies always arises during clean up events and in the past, the entire county is allowed to benefit from tire disposal at the landfill and car body disposal (free of fluids) at the landfill as well. It is staff opinion that this trend would continue and the entire county could benefit from disposal of those two types of waste at the same time as the community event in Sierraville.

Recommendation: It is recommended that the Board of Supervisors authorize the community clean up event (day to be announced) for Sierraville and direct staff to coordinate the event, communicate with the County contractor, and issue proper public notices to engage as many community members as possible.

City of Loyalton Clean-up Event

Monday June 8 through Wednesday June 10

WHO: Residential properties within the City of Loyalton

WHAT: Curbside pick-up of wood waste, large bulky items, metals, and even autos (with an advance appointment)!

WHEN: Properties north of Highway 49 will be served on Monday, June 8...**ONLY** and properties south of Highway 49 will be served on Tuesday, June 9...**ONLY**. The mobile home park on the western edge of Loyalton will be served on Wednesday, June 10.

COST: NO COST to the owner

Waste types may not be mixed. Woods, large bulky items (furniture, cabinets, dog houses, etc.), and metals (appliances) must be in separate piles on the curb or immediately within the **front yard area** of residences, and must be clearly marked for pickup **on the dates identified above**. Please do not stockpile materials in the traveled way of any street or alley. These items will be loaded into disposal bins for transportation to the landfill **ONLY** on the dates identified above.

Hazardous wastes, e-wastes, any fluids, campers, trailers, mobilehomes, medical waste, inert waste (concrete, rocks, dirt), or household/wet garbage **are not included in this event**. Unsorted materials and materials that are not within the definition of the approved materials will be left on the property.

Wood wastes will be hauled to the SPI Cogeneration plant. Property owners will be required to pile tree limbs, branches, trimmings, and unprocessed wood at the front curb of their property for pick up and disposal. Wood wastes must be cut into lengths not exceeding six feet and must be piled on the **front yard area**.

For disposal of vehicles, an advance appointment is required. Contact the City of Loyalton at 993-6750 or the Sierra County Department of Public Works at 289-3201 for an appointment. Vehicles must be free of any oils and fluids, and upon verification of this condition, vehicles will be towed to the landfill for processing and demolition. Fluids can be delivered to the County landfill for disposal during regular open hours by the owner free of charge. Vehicle "Certificates of Title" documents (pink slips) are desired but not required from vehicle owners.

Senior Citizens or disabled contact the City of Loyalton at 993-6750 for assistance.

NOTE: For all County residents and for City residents who were unable to participate in the clean up event, the County landfill will be open June 6 (Saturday) and 7 (Sunday) and vehicles and large bulky items can be disposed of free of charge. The same conditions as noted above apply (free of fluids, etc) and you must self-haul to the landfill during normal business hours.

This event is a cooperative effort of the City of Loyalton, the County of Sierra, Sierra Solid Waste, and the Sierra County Firesafe and Watershed Council
